






THE ROSE ~ LOVE OF OUR NEIGHBOR Kindheartedness



THE VIOLET ~ HUMILITY The Maiden's Ornament

FROM the beginning of the world God inculcated humility and lowliness of spirit upon women. Immediately after the Fall she was told that she must be in subjection, the practice of humility being thus imposed upon her as a punishment. On the other hand, the consequence of original sin, namely, the tendency of the human heart to evil, consists, in the case of the woman, precisely in a constant endeavor to rebel, in a spirit of pride, against the sentence of punishment pronounced by God.

The violet of humility is indeed one of the fairest ornaments of woman, and of the young girl more especially.


