Convert us, O God of our salvation: and that this Lenten fast may profit us, instruct our minds in heavenly knowledge.

7

Look down upon Thy family, O Lord: and grant that we who punish ourselves by mortification of the flesh, may have our minds shining before Thee, with the desire of Thee.

8 and 9

Graciously regard, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the devotion of Thy people: that they who by abstinence mortify their bodies, may in mind be refreshed by the fruit of good works.

10

Be Thou, O Lord, propitious to Thy people; and out of Thy compassion cheer with gracious help those whom Thou dost render devoted to Thee.

11

The prayers of Thy people, do Thou, O Lord, graciously hear; that we who are justly afflicted for our sins, may for the glory of Thy Name, be mercifully delivered.

12

SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT.

O God, Who seest us to be destitute of strength, do Thou both inwar lly and outwardly keep us; that in body we may be defended from all adversities, and in mind cleansed from evil thoughts.

13

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that we Thy family, who, to punish our bodies, abstain from food, may, by striving after justice, keep free from sin.

14

Graciously perfect within us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the help given us in this holy observance: that we, who, through Thine example, know that we ought to undertake this fast, may accomplish it, through Thy working.

15

Mercifully regard Thy people, we beseech Thee, O Lord; and grant that they whom Thou commandest to abstain from carnal food, may also cease from noxious vices.

16

Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the help of Thy grace; that duly intent on fasting and prayer, we may be delivered from the enemies of mind and body.

17

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that by the purifying power of this sacred fast, Thou wouldst make us to arrive with sincere minds at the coming holy festivities.

18

Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, a salutary effect to our fasts: that the mortifying of the flesh which we have undertaken, may promote the quickening of our souls.

19

THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT.

We beseech Thee, Almighty God: regard the desires of those that humble themselves, and for our defense, stretch forth the right hand of Thy Majesty.

20

Graciously pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts: that as we abstain from carnal food, so also we may draw back our senses from hurtful excesses.

21

Graciously hear us, Almighty and Merciful God; and propitiously grant to us the gift of a salutary temperance.

22

Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that trained by this salutary fasting, and abstaining also from hurtful vices, we may the more readily obtain Thy mercy.

23

May this solemn commemoration of the martyrdom of Thy Saints, Cosmas and Damianus, glorify Thee, O Lord; whereby Thou didst out of Thine unspeakable providence, both grant everlasting glory to them and help to us.

24

Do Thou, we beseech Thee, O Lord, help on our fasting with Thy bounteous favor; that even as in body we abstain from food, so in mind we may refrain from vices.

25

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that they who, to afflict their flesh, abstain from food, may, by following justice, fast from sin.

26

FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT.

Grant, we seseech Thee, Almighty God, that we who justly suffer for our deeds, may be relieved by the comfort of Thy grace.

27

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that devoutly performing these sacred and annual observances, we may please Thee both in mind and in body.

28

May the fasts of this sacred observance obtain for us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, both an increase in the piety of our lives, and the ever-present help of Thy propitiation.

29

O God, Who both grantest to the just the rewards of their merits, and to sinners pardon through fasting: have mercy upon Thy suppliants, that the confession of our guilt may avail to obtain for us the pardon of our offenses.

30

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that we, whom our votive fasts do chastise, may also be gladdened by this holy devotion: that by the weakening of earthly affections, we may more readily lay hold of heavenly things.

31

O God, Who renewest the world by means of wonderful Sacraments: grant, we beseech Thee, that Thy Church may both profit by Thine eternal institutions, and not be deprived of temporal help.

32

May the affection of our devotion, we beseech Thee, O Lord, be made fruitful by

Thy grace; for then shall the fasts which we have undertaken profit us, if they are pleasing to Thy bounty.

33

PASSION SUNDAY.

We beseech Thee, Almighty God, mercifully look upon Thy family: that by Thy bounty it may be governed in body, and by Thy protection guarded in mind.

34

Sanctify our fasts, we beseech Thee, O Lord; and mercifully grant to us the pardon of all our faults.

35

May our fasts be acceptable to Thee, O Lord, we beseech Thee; these fasts which, by making expiation for our sins, may, we trust, render us worthy of Thy grace, and likewise lead us to the everlasting remedies.

36

Having sanctified this our fast, do Thou, O God, mercifully enlighten the hearts of Thy faithful: and graciously grant a favorable hearing to the prayers of those upon whom Thou bestowest the sentiments of devotion.

37

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that the dignity of our human nature, impaired by excess, may be reformed by the pursuit of a health-giving moderation.

38

Graciously pour forth Thy grace into our hearts, we beseech Thee, O Lord: that repressing our sins by a voluntary chastisement, we may rather suffer in this life, than be condemned to eternal punishment.

39

May the people that is dedicated to Thee progress, we beseech Thee, O Lord, in the sentiments of a pious devotion, that instructed in these sacred Mysteries, the more they become pleasing to Thy Majesty, the more they may abound in choicest gifts.

40 PALM SUNDAY.

Almighty and everlasting God, Who didst cause Our Saviour to take upon Him our flesh, and suffer on the Cross, that all mankind might have His example of humility for their imitation: grant that we may both keep in mind the lessons of His patience,

and be made partakers of His Resurrection.

41

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that we who through our infirmity fail in so many difficulties, may breathe anew through the interceding Passion of Thy Son.

42

Almighty and everlasting God, grant that we may so celebrate the mysteries of the Lord's Passion, as to deserve to obtain Thy pardon.

43

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that we, who by reason of our excesses are unceasingly afflicted, may obtain deliverance through the Passion of Thine onlybegotten Son.

44 and 45.

O God, from Whom on the one hand Judas received the punishment of his crime, and the Thief on the other obtained the reward of his confession: grant us the effect of Thy mercy; that even as Our Lord Jesus Christ, during His Passion, thus dealt out to each the different wages of their deserts, so, having destroyed in us the errors of our old nature, He would grant us the grace of His Resurrection.

O God, Who hast wonderfully created man, and more wonderfully redeemed him: grant us, we beseech thee, such strength of mind and reason against the allurements of sin, that we may deserve to obtain eternal joys.

Mine eye is troubled through indignation: I have grown old amongst all mine enemies.

Depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity: for the Lord hath heard the voice of my weeping.

The Lord hath heard my supplication: the Lord hath received my prayer.

Let all mine enemies be put to shame, and be sore troubled: let them be turned back, and put to shame very speedily.

2. PSALM XXXI.

Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven: and whose sins are covered.

Blessed is the man to whom the Lord hath not imputed sin: and in whose spirit there is no guile.

Because I was silent, my bones grew old: whilst I cried out all the day long.

For day and night Thy hand was heavy upon me: I am turned in my anguish, whilst the thorn is fastened.

I have acknowledged my sin unto Thee: and mine iniquity I have not concealed.

I said, I will confess against myself mine iniquity unto the Lord: and Thou hast forgiven the wickedness of my sin.

For this shall every one that is holy pray

to Thee: in a seasonable time.

And yet in a flood of many waters: they shall not come nigh unto him.

Lord, all my desire is before Thee: and my groaning is not hid from Thee.

My heart is troubled, my strength hath forsaken me: and the light of mine eyes itself is not with me.

My friends and my neighbors have drawn near: and stood against me.

And they that were near me stood afar off: and they that sought after my soul used violence.

They that sought my hurt spoke vain things: and thought upon deceits all the day long.

But I, as a deaf man, heard not: and I was as a dumb man that doth not open his mouth.

And I became as a man that heareth not: and that hath no reproofs in his mouth.

For in Thee, O Lord, have I hoped: Thou wilt hear me, O Lord my God.

For I said, Lest at any time mine enemies rejoice over me: and whilst my feet slip, they glory over me.

For I am ready for scourges: and my sorrow is continually before me.

For I will declare mine iniquity: and I

will be thoughtful of my sin.

But mine enemies live, and are stronger than I: and they that hate me wrongfully are multiplied.

They that render evil for good have slandered me: because I followed goodness.

Forsake me not, O Lord my God: do not Thou depart from me.

Give heed unto my help, O Lord: Thou God of my salvation.

4. PSALM L.

Have mercy upon me, O God: according to Thy great mercy.

And according to the multitude of Thy tender mercies: blot out my iniquity.

Wash me yet more from my iniquity: and cleanse me from my sin.

For I acknowledge my iniquity: and my sin is always before me.

Against Thee only have I sinned, and done evil in Thy sight: that Thou mayest be justified in Thy words, and mayest over-

come when Thou art judged.

For behold, I was conceived in iniq-

uities: and in sins did my mother conceive me.

For behold, Thou hast loved truth: the secret and hidden things of Thy wisdom Thou hast made manifest unto me.

Thou shalt sprinkle me with hyssop, and I shall be cleansed: Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be made whiter than snow.

Thou shalt make me hear of joy and gladness: and the bones that were humbled shall rejoice.

Turn away Thy face from my sins: and blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God: and renew a right spirit within me.

Cast me not away from Thy face: and take not Thy Holy Spirit from me.

Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation: and strengthen me with a perfect spirit.

I will teach the unjust Thy ways: and the wicked shall be converted unto Thee.

Deliver me from sins of blood, O God, Thou God of my salvation: and my tongue shall extol Thy justice.

Thou shalt open my lips, O Lord: and my mouth shall declare Thy praise.

For if Thou hadst desired sacrifice, I would surely have given it: with burnt-offerings Thou wilt not be delighted.

A sacrifice unto God is a troubled spirit: a contrite and humble heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise.

Then shalt Thou accept the sacrifice of justice, oblations, and whole burnt-offerings: then shall they lay calves upon Thine altar.

For I have eaten ashes as it were bread: and mingled my drink with weeping.

Because of Thine indignation and wrath: for Thou hast lifted me up and cast me down.

My days have gone down like a shadow: and I am withered like the grass.

But Thou, O Lord, endurest for ever: and Thy memorial unto all generations.

Thou shalt arise, and have mercy upon Sion: for it is time that Thou have mercy upon her; yea, the time is come.

For Thy servants have delighted in her stones: and they shall have pity on the earth thereof.

And the Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory.

For the Lord hath built up Sion: and He shall be seen in His glory.

He hath had regard unto the prayer of the lowly: and hath not despised their petition.

Let these things be written for another

generation: and the people that shall be created shall praise the Lord;

That He might hear the groaning of them that are in fetters: that He might deliver the children of the slain;

That they may declare the name of the Lord in Sion: and His praise in Jerusalem.

When the people assembled together: and the kings to serve the Lord.

He answered him in the way of his strength: Declare unto me the fewness of my days.

Call me not away in the midst of my days: Thy years are unto generation and generation.

Thou, Lord, in the beginning didst lay the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of Thy hands.

They shall perish, but Thou endurest: and they all shall grow old as a garment.

And as a vesture shalt Thou change them, and they shall be changed: but Thou art the same, and Thy years shall not fail.

X. Jesus is stripped of His garments.

I will be Thy faithful follower. My conduct will never shame Thee before men.

XI. Jesus is nailed to the Cross.

Thy commands mean that I should conquer every unholy desire. I will conquer in Thy name.

XII. Jesus dies on the Cross.

When my hour comes, may I die bravely, dear Jesus for Thee.

XIII. Jesus is taken down from the Cross.

In trial, in affliction, in the hour of death, Thou, O Lord, though unseen, wilt always be with me.

XIV. Jesus is laid in the sepulcher.

Thee, my loving Master, will I always serve. With Thee I live, and with Thee die.

FATHER, FORGIVE THEM, FOR THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO.

O beloved Jesus, Who for the love of me didst agonize on the Cross that Thou mightest pay by Thy sufferings the debt due to my sins, and didst open Thy divine mouth to obtain my pardon from eternal Justice: have mercy on all the faithful in their agony, and on me also when I shall be in that extremity, and, through the merits of Thy most Precious Blood shed for our salvation, give us so lively a sorrow for our sins that we may breathe out our souls into the bosom of Thine infinite mercy.

V. Have mercy on us, O Lord.

R. Have mercy on us.

O my God, I believe in Thee, I hope in Thee, I love Thee, and I repent of having offended Thee by my sins.

The Second Word.

R. Because by Thy holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

O beloved Jesus, Who for the love of me didst agonize on the Cross, and, heaping suffering on suffering, didst endure with infinite patience not only Thy many bodily tortures, but the most heavy affliction of spirit through the Dereliction of Thine Eternal Father: have mercy on all the faithful in their agony, and on me also when I shall be in that extremity, and, through the merits of Thy most Precious Blood, give us grace to suffer with true patience all the pains and afflictions of our agony, that, uniting them with Thine, we may be partakers of Thy glory in Paradise.

O beloved Jesus, Who didst agonize on the Cross for the love of me, and Who, not satisfied with all the ignominy and suffering, wouldst willingly have suffered yet more, so that all men might be saved —as was clearly proved when all the torrents of Thy Passion would not allay the Thirst of Thy tender Heart: have mercy on all the faithful in their agony, and on me also when I shall be in that extremity, and, through the merits of Thy most Precious Blood, enkindle such a fire of charity in our hearts as may cause them to burn with the desire of uniting themselves to Thee for all eternity.

O beloved Jesus, Who for the love of me didst agonize on the Cross, and from that Throne of Truth didst announce the completion of the work of our Redemption, through which, from being the children of wrath and perdition, we are become the children of God and the heirs of Heaven: have mercy on all the faithful in their agony, and on me also when I shall be in that extremity, and, through the merits of Thy most Precious Blood, detach us entirely from the world and from ourselves, and at the moment of our agony give us

grace sincerely to offer Thee the sacrifice of our life in expiation of our sins.
